ITEM NO. 1: CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Mincer called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm opening with the Pledge of Allegiance. He announced that there would be an Executive Session following the Public Comment Period to discuss current litigation.

ITEM NO. 2: APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Karen Kleist informed the Board that the Minutes from last week's meeting are not complete yet.

ITEM NO. 3: PRESENTATION
Pike Co. Tick Borne Diseases Task Force

Mikki Weiss and Dr. Robert Olar of the Pike County Tick Borne Diseases Task Force gave a presentation on the extent of tick borne diseases (it's not just Lyme), the health ramifications (untreated they can become chronic and even cause death), diagnosis and treatment difficulties, and other topics. They have developed a Questionnaire to collect hard data/statistics that can be used to substantiate the endemic. The Board agreed to put the Questionnaire on our website and make it available to residents.

ITEM NO. 4: OLD BUSINESS A) Bid Award - Road Materials The Board reviewed the results of the May 2, 2016 Bid Opening (attached) and Solicitor Klemeyer reviewed the bid bonds received. He noted that the bond from Edwards Sand and Stone was not signed and therefore invalid. Edwards was the low bidder for the antiskid and recommended by Jim Snyder. MOTION was made by Thomas Mincer, seconded by Kerry Welsh, and unanimously carried to award the bid for all items except antiskid to Eureka Stone Quarry as the low bidder/closest proximity to Township Garage, and to table the award of antiskid to discuss with Jim Snyder.
