ITEM NO. 1: CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Mincer called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm opening with the Pledge of Allegiance. There will be an Executive Session immediately following the Public Comment Period to discuss a personnel matter.

ITEM NO. 2: APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION was made by Dennis Brink, seconded by Kerry Welsh, and unanimously carried to approve the August 15, 2017 Minutes as presented.

ITEM NO. 3: OLD BUSINESS
A) Bid Open/Award: Treated Salt

Two bids for 300 tons of Treated Sodium Chloride; the envelope from Compass Materials only included a "No Bid" letter. Cargill submitted a bid in the amount of \$75.97/ton. Following discussion with the Roadmaster, MOTION was made by Kerry Welsh, seconded by Dennis Brink, and unanimously carried to award the contract for 300 tons of treated sodium chloride to Cargill Salt in the amount of \$75.97 per ton.

ITEM NO. 3(B): Other Old Business There was no Other Old Business at this time.

ITEM NO. 4: NEW BUSINESS
A) Proposed Zoning Amendment
Camp regulations

The Board reviewed the proposed regulations for camps and daycamps. Solicitor Klemeyer explained that there currently are no provisions for (new) camps; the existing camps have been there long before the Township had zoning. The proposed ordinance amendment has been forwarded to the Township and County Planning Commissions for review, and has been advertised for Public Hearing on September 19, 2017.

ITEM NO. 4(B): Budget Workshop Schedule The Board approved the budget workshop schedule as follows: October 3 & 17 and November 7 & 21 at 6:00 pm and following the regular meeting on those dates, and on October 24th at 7:00 pm.

ITEM NO. 4(C): 2017 Pike County Township Officials Convention The Annual Pike County Township Officials Convention will be held on October 6 at the Lackawaxen Inn. The Board authorized Karen and Jim to attend, and also any Planning Commission or Zoning Hearing Board member that wishes to go.

ITEM NO. 4(D): Disabled Veteran Tax Exemption The Board received notification that the Department of Veterans Affairs has determined Joseph Aun eligible for real estate tax exemption effective August 7, 2017. MOTION was made by Dennis Brink, seconded by Kerry Welsh, and unanimously carried to approved the disabled veteran property tax exemption for Joseph Aun, effective August 7, 2017.

ITEM NO. 4(E): Pension - 2018 Minimum Municipal Obligation (MMO) Karen Kleist presented the completed MMO Worksheet to the Board, which applies a formula determined by PMRS to projected 2017 annual wages. The Township's 2018 MMO is \$44,876.00. MOTION was made by Kerry Welsh, seconded by Dennis Brink, and unanimously carried to approve the 2018 Pension MMO of \$44.876.

ITEM NO. 4(F): Other New Business There was no Other New Business at this time.

ITEM NO. 5: CORRESPONDENCE A) Appletree Resource Group

The Board was in receipt of a letter from the management company for Sunrise Lake Section 9 Water & Sewer Association requesting an extension of time from the timeline set by the Board for completion of testing, etc. due to the testing schedule with PaDEP continuing into mid September. Chris Wood recommended extending the due date to October 20, 2017 for completion of testing and

submission of a Sewage Planning Module. MOTION was made by Dennis Brink, seconded by Kerry Welsh, and unanimously carried to extend the deadline to October 20, 2017.
