For lots under one (1) acre in size, the site plan must be in the form of a survey map prepared by a Pennsylvania registered surveyor. All site plans must be drawn to scale. All dimensions must be accurate.

2. Place a stake with the word "Well" written on it on the property at the location in which the well is to be drilled.

If checked by the issuing officer, this permit is to drill a new well and to permanently seal an existing well. Failure to properly and permanently seal the existing well in a manner prescribed by law will result in fines and/or other enforcement actions.

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WELL APPLICATION WORKSHEET

This form is to serve as a **GUIDELINE** when completing a Well Permit Application and shall accompany your submission for a single-family residential well permit.

The following items shall be included with your submission: Well Application Worksheet, Well Application and a site plan showing all of the following items. **The site plan must be drawn to scale; example – 1" = 20', or 1" = 40', 1" = 50'.** Please indicate that you have complied with the requirements by checking the boxes next to each item submitted. Please include all of the items listed that are required to complete the review and approval process. Missing items will cause delays in permit processing.

- A completed well permit application signed and dated by the applicant.
- A site plan showing all of the following:
 - The property lines and dimensions of the subject property.
 - The road on which the property fronts and the right-of-way distance.
 - All existing and proposed structures.
 - The proposed well location and the distance to the two closest property corners.
 - The location of any existing and proposed sewage drain-fields and their distances to the proposed well.
 - The location of all existing sewage drain-fields on neighboring properties and their distance to the proposed well. Note: This includes properties across the street from the subject property.
 - The location of all sewage drain-fields for systems that have been permitted on neighboring properties but have not yet been constructed and their distance to the proposed well. Note: This includes properties across the street from the subject property
 - The location of existing and proposed sewage tanks and their distances to the proposed well.
 - The identity of all neighboring lots showing Section/Block/Lot. In the event a neighboring lot(s) is VACANT, please indicate by writing the word VACANT.
- This well application worksheet.

If the property is less than one (1) acre in size, a Certified Surveyor must draw the site plan. If any of the above information is not completed or is not submitted, a delay may result in the processing of the application.

NOTE: While Township staff may offer assistance in the completion of the Well Application, the onus remains on the property owner to prepare a proper site plan and to locate and accurately represent the location of all existing and proposed sewage drain-fields on the subject property and neighboring properties. If you cannot do so yourself, you must hire the services of a draftsman, surveyor, or engineer or other competent professional to assist in securing your permit.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All water wells shall be constructed in accordance with all applicable state regulations. In addition, the well shall be constructed so that the casing extends a **minimum of 12 inches** above the ground surface.

After completion of drilling, the well shall be sealed with an appropriate **sanitary well cap** that is designed to prevent surface containments from entering the well and meets the requirements of standard PAS-97 of the Water Systems Council. No well shall be permitted at any time to be without a properly installed sanitary well cap.

All wells must be connected to the structure or use for which the well was intended to serve within two years of permit issuance unless an extension has been granted by the Board of Supervisors. Wells found to be in violation of this requirement shall be considered abandoned and ordered to be permanently sealed at the property owner's expense.

All abandoned wells must be permanently sealed in a manner approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources or its successor agency.

No property may have more than one water well unless approved, for cause, by the Board of Supervisors.
